Logan City will offer curbside green waste collection for \$4/month starting March 28. Call their office to sign up. A community green waste drop is available in Nibley from April to November at 296 W. 3200 S. The green waste is turned into compost and mulch which can then be purchased from the Logan City landfill for a minimal cost. Summer landfill hours begin April 1 and will be from 8:00 a.m. - 6:30 p.m., Mon. to Fri. and 8:00 a.m. - 5:30 p.m., Sat. The landfill is located at 450 N. 1000 W. in Logan. Dear Nibley Citizens:

From the Mayor

Winter weather stayed around a little longer than usual this year. I love winter and hate to see it go. However, it is very nice to have spring here. I am sure our road crews are glad not to spend their late evening and early morning hours plowing snow. Now, it is time to prepare the parks for the coming many people that will frequent them.

We held a ground breaking ceremony for our new city hall building on March 3. I appreciate all of those who attended to witness this historic event. The building is being built at 445 West 3200 South. Drive by occasionally to see the progress. It will be completed by December 1, 2011.

The 2010 Census shows that we had 5,438 people residing in Nibley City. The 2000 Census counted 2,042 people. We have experienced a significant growth rate over the past ten years. We have planned well to accommodate for this growth with minimal negative impact on our residents. Our taxes have stayed the same over these years, meaning the new growth has paid for their increased need for services. There are many positives associated with this growth: our culinary water system is considerably more reliable now than ten years ago, our parks and roads have been improved, and we have welcomed many wonderful people to our community. We continue to plan for the next several decades with an update to our Parks and Trails Master Plan that should be approved by the City Council in the coming weeks. This plan details a monumental undertaking by Nibley City. The 2010 census indicates there are 2,359 people under the age of 18 in Nibley. We have tremendous demand for recreational services in the city. We have felt this pressure and are responding to and planning for it. The proposed park plan addresses the next 30 years of growth with the design of a 50-acre park complex. We will build this large complex while maintaining and improving our smaller parks throughout the community, all without the need to raise taxes. This plan will continue the tradition of setting aside open space for recreational purposes well into Nibley's future.

The Tree Board met again this past month to discuss a proposed Streetscape Ordinance. We are considering requiring trees be planted in the park-strip area of each new subdivision. These trees would be of the same general type for each subdivision with different varieties recommended for different subdivisions to enhance their unique character. The Board is identifying the types of trees that will work best in the different soils and sizes of the park-strips. This proposal will be reviewed by the Planning Commission and must be adopted by the City Council before it goes into effect. If you have ideas concerning trees in Nibley and, specifically, a Streetscape Ordinance, please contact a member of the Tree Board or me. Thanks for your suggestions and continued support.
