#### BE A RESPONSIBLE PET OWNER - SPAY / NEUTER

Did you know that almost 31,000 cats and dogs were euthanized in Utah in 2010? The number of homeless cats and dogs in the state continues to rise each year. The best way to avoid the

problem of unwanted homeless animals, and one of the kindest things you can do for your pet, is to spay or neuter them. Schedule an appointment with your vet today or take advantage of several low-cost programs that are offered in Utah.

Locally, the Cache Humane Society has opened their spay and neuter program to the public (S.N.I.P.: (Spay/Neuter Intervention Program). To schedule an appointment, call 435-792-3920. Walk-ins are also accepted from 9:00 - 11:00 a.m. on surgery days, as time permits. The surgeries are held most Fridays at the Cache Humane Society (2370 W. 200

N., Logan). Prices are: cat neuter - \$35, cat spay - \$45, dog neuter - \$50, dog spay - \$60, dogs 75 lbs and over - \$1 per pound. \*\*Extra charges may apply for animals in heat, pregnant, or with special conditions. \*\* For more information, call the shelter or visit their website at www.cachehumane.org.
