**From the Mayor**

The Nibley City Tree Board decided to celebrate Arbor Day in conjunction with Nibley Heritage Days this year. We will have a booth at the Carnival on Saturday, June 18, where we will provide tree trimming and tree planting instructions. Literature on the types of trees that grow best in Nibley as well as the approved list of trees for the various sizes of park strips in the city will be available. Our Arbor Day celebration will conclude with the planting of a tree in Clear Creek Park across the street from the carnival at Heritage Park at 2:00 p.m. Please come and visit with members of Nibley City's Tree Board and professional arborists to learn how to care for your trees and how they make our homes and neighborhoods more enjoyable.

I wish to compliment all of those that have been involved in preparing for the high river flows we have experienced this spring. A lot of water came down and continues to flow in the river. Thanks to prior planning, preparation, and cooperation, we have avoided much frustration and property damage. I am especially thankful of the City workers who have been very willing to sacrifice some personal time at moment's notice to run to the next emergency site. We recently refined our emergency procedure for managing flooding on the river and for the most part did not have to use this procedure due to the careful preparations taken. I am grateful to the many residents who gave of their time and energy as well as the many property owners along the river that shared their wisdom, insight, and property allowing the city to fix areas of concern that threatened to flood downstream residents of Nibley. With this type of cooperation, we can mitigate any potential disaster that presents itself.

There are several key events that are taking place in the City. The City Council passed a preliminary city budget last month. Our budget is in good shape. As usual, we received more revenue than we planned for allowing us to invest in additional capital projects and equipment. This extra money is limited but facilitates the efficiency of our Public Works Department. The next big project for the City will be the purchase of the property for our 50-acre city park outlined in the recently approved Park Plan. We hope to acquire this land before the end of the year. And finally, the construction of the new City Hall is proceeding ahead of schedule. Drive by and see the progress at 450 West 3200 South.

We will celebrate Nibley Heritage Days on June 13-18. There are activities and events that include everyone in your home. I extend a special invitation to everyone to attend the Mayor's Dinner on Friday night, June 17. Come and see your City Council in action as they serve you dinner.

I hope you will enjoy the last days of spring and the beginning of summer. I thank everyone who helps make Nibley City home. Your efforts are admired.
