

From the Mayor

Dear Nibley Residents,

Recently, our Planning and Zoning Commissioners reviewed, and forwarded to the City Council for approval, the Nibley City Legacy Tree Program. This program gives residents the opportunity to provide a living tribute to a friend or family member. Residents may purchase a tree for \$200 that will be planted on city property and dedicated to an individual. A plaque will be placed at the location of the tree with the honoree's name. I believe this is another way to beautify our city, pay tribute to a loved one, and create more ownership of the city for each of our residents. I compliment the Nibley City Tree Board for their vision in recommending this wonderful program. More information on this program is available at City Hall. All applications require city approval.

The City Council will be working on the city budget during the month of June. We are required by state law to approve a budget by June 22 each year. We will hold the required public hearing for the budget on **June 7**. Our city finances are in great shape. Our contingency funds are in better shape than they have been for years, giving us additional one-time money to shore up beautification projects in the city. Come join the City Council as we debate the use of your money.

Heritage Days is our annual city celebration. It will be held June 18 to 23 this year. The city council has allocated \$13,000 for this celebration. The enclosed flyer for Heritage Days details the many activities for you, family, and friends. Come celebrate Nibley's 77-year anniversary. A new feature of Heritage Days is the Mayor's First Annual Art Show & Contest. I hope to showcase the wonderful artists that live and work in Cache Valley, many of whom reside in Nibley City. I also want to encourage budding artists to show off their work. The Art Show will be held at City Hall from June 20 to 23. 

Get Connected to Nibley City with Affordable Home Internet Access


If your child receives free or reduced price school lunches, you may qualify for Internet EssentialsSM from Comcast. At a cost of \$9.95 + tax per month you can have internet service to your home that includes parental controls and top-rated Norton security. There is also a low-cost computer available at initial enrollment for \$149.99. To qualify you must be located where Comcast offers internet service, have at least one child receiving free or reduced lunches through the National School Lunch Program, have not subscribed to Comcast Internet service within the last 90 days, and not have an overdue Comcast bill or unreturned equipment.
