From the Mayor

Dear Nibley Residents,

Spring time has brought many in the city together in service projects. The Nibley City Royalty organizes service projects as part of their pageant participation. One of these service projects was the beautification of the entrance to Nibley at the Meadow View Subdivision on the corner of 1600 West and 3200 South. This is a project that will brighten the day of all who drive by it during the year. Other projects include building luminaries for the nativity program at Morgan Farm, rebuilding the Nibley City parade float, and collecting items to be given to a group in need. I appreciate everyone that helps with these projects throughout the year. They quietly go about serving others. Drive by and enjoy the work of residents making the city a better place to live.

On this note, a new addition to Nibley's Heritage Days celebration will be a city-wide service project. We plan to work on several projects as a city on **Monday, June 17**. Some of the planned projects will be the planting of trees along 3200 South, beautifying Morgan Farm, and working on the 250 West Neighborhood Park. Call me with if you have other suggestions.

Last month the state legislature changed the filing period for municipal elections to **June 3–7** during business hours. Please note this change on your calendar. There are three positions up for election this year; two City Council members, and the Mayor. I encourage everyone that is interested to get involved and have the experience of a life time. Nibley City needs good women and men to serve in these positions. They are instrumental in making Nibley City a wonderful community.

Once again, it is budget time in Nibley City. We are busy putting together the details of our next fiscal year's budget. We will hold budget hearings over the next few months before approving the budget by June 22 as required by state law. If you have input on budget issues, please call me so that the City Council can consider your ideas.

Nibley City's patronage of the Hyrum Library continues to grow. We have 632 families with Hyrum Library cards. As a public service, we pay \$18,960 annually to partner with Hyrum City on the library. Any resident of Nibley can obtain a library card at no additional cost. Ginny Tremayne, a Nibley resident, is the director of the library and would love to answer questions you may have about the library. Our library is the most efficient library of its size in the state. This is a wonderful service to Nibley City residents and I encourage you to check it out.

Finally, this is the second year of the Mayor's Annual Art Show and Contest. We need volunteers to help with this big project. We will be working through the month of May soliciting participants. Last year's show was a tremendous success. The art will be displayed at City Hall from **June 19–22**. Thank you for your love of our great community.

Stormwater Reminder

What is storm water?

Storm water is runoff from rain and snow storms. A system of gutters, ditches and storm drains collect this runoff from our yards, rooftops, streets, parking lots and other land surfaces. This collection of water then discharges, untreated, directly into our natural waterways.

Help Keep Our Storm Water Clean

Storm water picks up pollutants as it flows across the land surfaces. Pollutants include litter and garbage, pesticides, fertilizer and yard waste, oil and antifreeze, paint and cleaners, pets and animal waste, and construction debris. Taking small steps to clean up and dispose of these items properly will make a big difference in keeping our natural waterways clean.

Reminders from Nibley City Staff

Remember to take the time to check and replace the batteries in your home smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. Our fire services, the Hyrum City Fire Department, recommends that residents test smoke and carbon monoxide detectors monthly and replace the batteries twice a year. If you didn't replace your batteries in the fall, you'll want to take the time to do it now.

Nibley's green waste bins are back at City Hall at 455 West 3200 South. Please use the site responsibly by helping keep it clean and by only dumping green waste in the bins. Please do not put dirt, rocks, garbage, plastic bags, sod, root balls, painted or treated wood, or anything over 6 ft. in length or 12 inches in diameter in the bins. There are also eight glass recycling drop sites within the county. Sites closest to Nibley are in Hyrum at 800 East Main, and in Providence at 350 East Center.

The summer is approaching quickly. Now is the time to make park and bowery reservations. These can be made by calling the city office. Weekends fill quickly for the three covered pavilions that can accommodate small or large groups.

There are vending machines with Coca-Cola products located at all of our city parks. **Pennies will not work in the machines.** If the machine "eats your money," please call **1-800-659-4395** and someone will assist you.

Garden Plots are now available for the 2013 planting season at the Nibley Community Garden at the Morgan Farm. The garden is located at **770 West 2680 South, Nibley**, directly south of Elkhorn Park. Applications are available at Nibley City Hall, the USU Extension office, or on-line at www.tinyurl.com/nibleygarden. Please make checks payable to USU Extension. Checks and applications can be mailed to the USU Extension, 179 N Main Street, #111, Logan, UT 84321. For questions or for more information, call the **USU Extension Office at 752-6263** or **Bryan Hansen at 245-2168**. A general 10' X 20' gardening plot is \$20 or a garden box is \$10. A refundable \$15 cleaning deposit is also required. Additional plots are only an additional \$20 registration per plot. Permanent gardening plots and raised garden beds are also available. An automated sprinkling system is provided at no additional cost. For those demonstrating need, registration fees may be waived partially or in full.
