You can see a picture of our display on our website (and in this newsletter). The committee that built the display has the wonderful opportunity to share it at the State Fair in September. This is a unique and fun honor for Nibley City along with all those who helped create this work of art. I wish to recognize Rachel Fuller, Melissa Malan and Trudy Knight who coordinated the group of youth and adults that helped on this project. This is the eighth year that they have made a booth for Nibley City each year doing a fabulous job.

Volunteers are some of the most important people in a city. They provide the unique flavor in a community. They beautify and give it personality. The City Council recently approved the purchase of a subdivision lot on 250 W. 3650 S. for the development of a neighborhood park.
