Thoughts From Our Mayor

I'm looking forward to another year of service and working with you all. Last month, at the city's annual holiday dinner, I asked the city's department heads to give me a list of what Nibley City had accomplished in 2016. I think it's pretty cool to see it all in one place and to be reminded of the progress we've made. I'm particularly proud of the \$825,000 in grant funding Nibley has recieved for parks and trails, the fact that I was finally able to check off one of my campaign promises to get not one, but two crosswalks across Highway 165, a General Plan that matches our community values with our budget priorities, and the effort we've made to align our government service with your priorities. So with that, here are the highlights:

Recreation–We created 6 new events and 4 new recreation programs, and made significant improvement to several other community programs and community outreach while developing a successful internship program to support and enhance all of our recreation programs.

Court–Valerie Steadman was hired and helped handle 817 court cases. *Planning*–Stephen Nelson was promoted to City Planner. The General Plan was revised and we began work to update the Park Master Plan.

Administration—The city started a leadership training program for employees and sent employees through Arbinger training. Cheryl Bodily became our new Notary Public. Michelle Jensen was hired as Nibley's new Treasurer and Jennifer Hendricks is new in Accounts Payable.

First Responders-They responded to 131 calls and covered 520 shifts.

City Council—Tom Bernhardt, Tim Ramirez and Larry Jacobsen were sworn in at the beginning of the year. The Council continued to work toward making sure that the budget matches the community's priorities established in our planning. They also renamed the park on 3200 South Anhder Park, in honor of Larry Anhder and his years of dedicated service to Nibley City. I started Muffins with the Mayor, a program to give people the opportunity to interact with me on a less formal basis.

Health and Safety–<u>A</u>utomated <u>E</u>xternal <u>D</u>efibrillators were installed in all city offices, Nibley City won the Bear River Health Department's Bike to Work award, and the city established quarterly wellness lunches with the Mayor.

Emergency Prep—Nibley staff was trained in the Incident Command System.

Public Works—Public works has kept very busy. They paved the public works yard, purchased a loader to help with snow removal, updated Nibley's standards and specs, and earned the Utah Local Governments Trust Safety award. Steve Eliason was hired as Nibley's Streets Superintendent and we took ownership of the new bridge over the Blacksmith Fork River. Public Works resurfaced more than a million square feet of roadway, repaved Nibley Park Ave, and installed the new crosswalk at 3200 South and State Road 165. The sewer department cleaned 16 miles of sewer line and repaired two major groundwater leaks while the water department drilled Nibley's new well (continued on page 3)

Dog License Renewal

It's time to make sure "man's best friend" has their license renewed. Nibley City ordinance requires that every dog be licensed annually.

- \$15.00 for a spayed or neutered dog
- \$25.00 for an unaltered dog
- \$25.00 kennel license

Registrations are due by February 28, 2017. Proof of current rabies vaccination is required for all dogs living in Nibley City. If you have more than two dogs, a kennel license is required. For a kennel license, you must be living on .75 acres or more of land, and get approval from the Planning & Zoning Commission.

Cache Valley Wildlife Association

If you love colorful songbirds coming around your home, work with your neighbors to combine various bird feeders and diverse foods. Birds are fun to watch, colorful, add natural music to your yard, and help with pollination and insect control during warm weather. Here are some tips to attract nature's singers:

- Black oil sunflower seeds. Birds toss aside others in a mixed-seed feeder just to get to the sunflowers with their high-fat content for winter.
- 2. Mixed seeds are cheaper and will attract ground feeding birds like Juncos, Towhees, and Pheasants.
- 3. Suet cakes infused with all kinds of seeds and fruit. Birds love this high-fat food for energy and winter warmth.
- 4. Water is tough to provide unless you live by the river or canal. There are heated water dishes which will help birds get the water they need in winter.



Here is a short list of Winter birds we are seeing in Nibley right now: Gold Finch, Black-capped Chickadee, Dark-Eyed Junco, House Sparrow, Northern Flicker, European Starling, Eurasian Collared Dove, Cassin's Finch, Spotted Towhee, Downy Woodpecker, Black-Billed Magpie, Pine Siskin, White-Crowned Sparrow, and Nuthatches.



Snow Removal

The snow is here and we would like to pass on a friendly reminder to residents to be attentive in keeping sidewalks clear. There can be a lot of pedestrian traffic on Nibley's sidewalks, even in the winter time, and especially if you live along a school route or one of Nibley's major thoroughfares. Nibley City Code (7-1-2) states that residents are required to remove the snow from their sidewalks within a reasonable time after a snowstorm has ended, which the City has interpreted to mean within twenty-four (24) hours after the storm is over.

The U.S. postal service also requires that you clear the front of your mailboxes of snow. If too much of the white stuff builds up in front of your mailbox your mail service may be interrupted so be sure to exercise those winter muscles and dig out your boxes.

UDOT Click N' Fix

UDOT maintenance employees take care of nearly 6,000 miles of highway around Utah They do an excellent job of finding and fixing issues before most of us even notice. However, with that many roads, you can help them by keeping an eye out for problems and letting them know about it. UDOT has implemented a new iPhone and Android app called *UDOT Click 'n Fix* which allows anyone to report an issue by dropping a pin on a map at the location of the problem.
