Thoughts From Our Mayor

Dear Citizens,

Thank you all for your support and patience as we worked through our water emergency this last month. When you see our city employees or emergency services workers, please feel free to acknowledge their service. Many of them worked around the clock for two days to get things under control, then continued to put in extra time after being forced to go rest. We have a dedicated, hard working crew. We are working now to document the lessons that we learned so that we can make sure that we are better prepared if and when we see something like this again. In the meantime, the Council has passed a measure to limit charges for the May water bill to the base rate for water (\$10.50). We will not be charged for the water that was used to flush the systems through your home water meters.

Councilwoman Amber Whittaker has been a phenominal public servant. I have grown to respect her ethics, her thought process, and her desire to make Nibley great. Unfortunately for all of us, but happily for her and her family, the Wittakers are moving out of the City. We will miss her and her family. We will also need to appoint a new council member to fill her place on the bench. Please apply at City Hall; contact David Zook for details.

To update you on sewer discussions, we have progressed past the study point and are now negotiating with Hyrum City and Logan City to see what is going to be the best long term solution for our sewer service. I will be brining a proposal to the Council in May or early June.

We are in the middle of our budget process for this year. The biggest items from my perspective are that I am proposing a full time position to corral all the responsibilities that have to do with community development; this will help people in several departments to focus and consolidate some part time positions. Our staff and volunteers do a great job but between the sports programs, our community services, our recreation activities, and our promotional efforts, we should see some efficiency gains from consolidating all this. The other big effort that I'm excited about is development of the new park section

Nibley City Tree Board

Plant trees while the Spring weather is here. Trees provide shade to help reduce lawn water usage. Water supplies may be questionable this year and lawn reduction might be worth the effort. Look for the Tree Board booth at the Heritage Days Festival on Saturday June 20.

The Tree Board succeeded in nominating the large crack willow on the fence-line of Heritage Park as a Heritage tree. This tree is reportedly on the site where Cache Valley's earliest settlement, Elkhorn Ranch, was located. Because of this nomination Nibley is being awarded \$250 from the NWF to purchase more trees.

Cache Valley Wildlife Association

The CVWA will have a booth at the Bear River Celebration at Willow Park in Logan on Saturday, June 6. They'd love to have help in making pine-cone bird feeders to give to the children. On Saturday, June 20, the CVWA will also have a booth at Heritage Park where they will give away trees to those who certify their property with the National Wildlife Federation. The process is easy and only takes a few minutes. Members of the CVWA will be available to talk you through the process and explain the benefits this one time \$20 fee will provide. Let's make sure Nibley City is Utah's first NWF Certified Community after Heritage Days. Finally, the CVWA will have free tours of wildlife gardens in Nibley which have already been NWF certified on June 27. Come see the diversity of 8 different yards in our city. City Council Election



Nibley City will hold its municipal election this fall to elect three city council members. If a Primary Election is necessary, the Primary Election date would be Tuesday, August 11, 2015. The General Election date will

be Tuesday, November 3, 2015.

City Council Members serve four-year terms and are elected at-large. The incumbents in the seats to be elected are: Larry Jacobsen, Ron Hellstern and the seat being vacated by Amber Whittaker.

Anyone interested in filing for one of these offices must:

- Be a U.S. citizen at time of filing
- Be a registered voter of Nibley City
- Be at least 18 years old
- Be a resident of Nibley City for at least 365 consecutive days immediately preceding the date of election (November 3, 2015)
- Not be a convicted felon

Each person seeking to become a candidate for a municipal office should file a Declaration of Candidacy in person with the Nibley City Recorder. Your declaration should be dropped off at Nibley City Hall during office hours and not later than 5:00 p.m. from June 1 through June 8, 2015.

Nibley City also encourages its citizens to remember to register to vote. You can do this online by going to https://secure.utah.gov/voterreg/. You can also sign up to vote by mail. Voting by mail is convenient and easy. You can avoid long lines and make your voice heard in the comfort of your own home. You can get the form to vote by mail at the following web address; http://www. elections.utah.gov/Media/Default/Documents/Elections%20Resources/Absentee%20Ballot%20Application.pdf. You can also request to be put on the permanent absentee voter list with this form so all ballots will be mailed to your home.
