Kindergarten Registration



If your child will turn 5 on or before September 1, 2014 and lives in the Cache County School District, now is the time to register your child for Kindergarten at all elementary schools. Registration dates are:

Tuesday, March 11 from 12:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. Wednesday, March 12 from 8:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m.

All children will need to bring a birth certificate, immunization records, and proof of residency. All children will have a brief kindergarten assessment on the day of registration. For more information or a list of all immunization requirements, visit *www.ccsdut.org*.





The deadline for licensing dogs for 2014 is **March 1.** This includes first time applicants as well as renewals. Annual fees are as follows:

- Spayed/neutered—\$15.00
- Unaltered dogs-\$25.00
- Kennel License—\$25.00

A \$10.00 late fee for each dog will be charged after March 1. You can also renew your dog license online by going to www.nibleycity.com and clicking on "Citizens" and then scroll down to "Dog Licensing" and finally, click on "Renew Dog License Online." If you have more than two dogs, a kennel license is required. Call the Nibley City Office if you have questions regarding renewal and/or kennel licenses. Dogs not previously registered with Nibley City must be registered in person at the Nibley City offices. Please bring proof of vaccinations and alteration.

Tech Tipspowered by Think Smart Computers.

We live in a fast-paced, ever-changing, technological world. So from time to time, we would like to offer some tips to help you keep up. This month we introduce "Tech Tips", brought to you by Derick at Think Smart Computers.

Q. "If Target can get hacked, is my banking information really secure online?"

Navigating the internet can be tricky especially when doing online banking or making credit card purchases. Here are a few important tips.

- 1. Make sure you are only shopping online with a credit card that offers online fraud protection. Never use your banking debit card. Most credit cards will refund a fraudulent transaction but most banks won't.
- 2. If you log in to banking websites to check your statements, use a different password for each site. An easy way to make a password you can remember is to take a word and switch the vowels for numbers or symbols and use at least 8 characters. Be sure to capitalize the first letter or last letter. For example "password" would be "p4ssw0rD" or "P@ssW0rd" with the "o" being a zero.
- 3. If you want really secure passwords and you don't want to remember them all, try to use a password managing software like "LastPass". Its free, secure and and can create and store secure passwords. It remembers all your pass words for you so you only have to remember one.
- 4. NEVER give anyone information over the phone or via email. Almost every "hack" is accomplished by using a small tricks to get small pieces of information over time. For example, hackers may have your address and they just need your mother's maiden name. They may need you to download something or go to a website. If you are suspicious of a call or an email, close the email or hang up, then call the bank directly or go to the bank's website directly by typing it yourself. Never use a link, type it in.
- 5. Change your passwords from time to time.

There is no way to fool proof anything in this new digital world. However, by changing a few small things, you can dramatically improve your security and protect yourself.
