Thoughts From Our Mayor

You need You

What makes a community a community? Something more than a bunch of people that live close to each other? Why do we live together in this town? Is it just to share costs on a water system? Is it so that we don't have to plow our own road, or so we can be closer to the school? If that's why we live here, that's cool. I appreciate and respect that. I've lived places where that was all I wanted from my town.

When I came to Nibley, I was tired of that. I wanted more. I wanted to have neighbors who looked out for my family, and in return I was willing to do my part to look out for them. When my kids played soccer, their coaches were volunteers. When I was a scoutmaster, I was a volunteer. When I found out that the EMTs that staff our ambulances and fix our bodies when we get hurt are my neighbors, I got really proud of this town and all the people that serve. A town where we share water and sewer is good, but a town where we really serve each other? That's where I want to live.

"I'm done," you say. "My kids are grown and I've done my time. I'm not good at anything. I'm shy, I'm tired, I'm busy." You feel have better things to do. On the other hand you may say "I'm young, my kids are small and I'll do it later." When I was a young Dad, I was asked to be a scoutmaster. My oldest son was a toddler and I said yes, but I was grumpy about it for a long time. I hated camping, and I felt terrible about taking time away from my family. Then I was talking to good friend about it one day, and he said "Shaun, I can appreciate where you're coming from. Have you thought about this though? What are you teaching those boys? You have daughters. When your daughters grow up, what kind of men do you want them spending time with? And who is going to be a scoutmaster for those young men? It won't be you. But you can be that for some other dad, and teach the boys that will date his daughters." And so it goes.

When we serve in a community, it may not be for our kids. It may not be for our grandkids. Heck, like our ambulance crews, it may not even be someone we know or will ever see again. But the fact that someone is willing to help is what makes a community, and what makes life worth living. You need you, because you make a difference in your community. We need you because you make a difference in our lives. So what can you do?

We have some specific needs where you can make a big difference in people's lives. Like sports? Coach a team, or help a coach. Like art? Like music? Like yardwork? Like horses? Like baking? Like pulling weeds or turning off lights? We can use you. If you have time and you want to serve, just contact our Nibley Recreation Director, Chad Wright; we will find something that you can do, and your time will make a difference.


Hyrum Museum

Red Curb Violations

The curb in front of Nibley Elementary at 660 West has become a serious problem to the safety of students at that school. The Sheriff's office intends to begin ticketing violators, but has kindly asked that Nibley City first try to get the word out to citizens to warn them. Please be aware of these zones when parking.

Malfunctioning Streetlights

If a street light in your neighborhood is not working properly, please call Nibley City and provide the location of the light. You can also contact Rocky Mountain Power directly at 1-888-221-7070 or www.rockymountainpower.net. Click on the "Safety and Outages" link, then click on "Streetlights" in the box on the left-hand side.

Snow Removal

Please remain attentive in keeping sidewalks clear of snow. Cache Valley is known for it's Spring snow storms and pedestrian traffic is getting heavier as the temperatures warm, especially along a school routes or one of Nibley's major thoroughfares. Residents are required to remove the snow from their sidewalks within twenty-four (24) hours after the storm is over.
