Thoughts From Our Mayor

Dear Nibley,

There are three things I need to cover today: Heritage Days, upcoming elections, and the Tin Rope subdivision.

Heritage days are coming up in six short weeks. Clear your calendar for June 12-17, because Nibley is going to be covered in awesomeness that you don't want to miss. For new "Niblites," Heritage Days is our annual, citywide, block party. The events range from arts and family activities to a parade, an original show with amazing talen from the recent talent show, a dance, the longest running community children's theater in the state, and of course dinner with me! It's a great time to have your family visit, to hang out with your neighbors, to sit by the side of the road, eat candy and look at fire trucks, or to run with your homies. It's also a great time to serve your neighbors by volunteering to put it all together! We are looking for volunteers, and we need YOU! It's also a great opportunity for EAGLE SCOUT candidates to find a service project. Just email Chad (chad@nibleycity.com) or call us at 752-0431. It's a heck of a lot of fun and the community needs you.

Nibley has seen some real challenges and changes over the past four years—contaminated water supply, big decisions about wastewater, the new high school, serious residential growth, development of the Malouf facility, the shift of Weathershield to Logan Coach, testing state law with our water rights, the biggest snowmelt/rainfall event in memory, developing public works development standards, and a new general plan. It's going to keep coming. If you have a vision for our City—if you love this town and see how we can be better in the future, we need you.

I have loved serving as your Mayor for the past three and a half years, and I hope to be able to continue to do so but if you have a vision for the future of Nibley and you want to get involved this is the time to get serious. This year, we will have a municipal election where the Mayor's office and two council seats are up for election. If you love this community, you see how we can make it even better, and you want to serve, then please come to the City Hall during office hours between **June 1 and June 7** and file your declaration of candidacy. You can't run if you don't file, and if you don't run you can't serve. If you want to get more information, or even if you think you might want to serve someday but maybe this isn't the right time, call me or come by on Tuesday during my office hours (8:00 a.m.–12:00 p.m. or by appointment at 752-0431), and I'll be glad to explain the process and give you the lowdown on what it takes to get involved.

Last but not least, this year I am buying some land to live on, and I'm in the process of subdividing the rest of the parcel under the Conservation Subdivision ordinance in Nibley. I am growing to really appreciate this ordinance. It's going to let me preserve a stream, a pond, an old farmstead, and about 5 acres of open pasture right in the heart of the City that all might otherwise have gone away. It's called Tin Rope (from Dustin and Ropelato, the buyer and seller of the land) and it's located across 3200 South from the Elkhorn Ranch

2017 Notice of Election

Nibley City will hold its municipal election this fall to elect a <u>Mayor</u> and <u>two council members</u>. If a Primary Election is necessary, the Primary Election date is <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>August 15</u>, 2017; the General Election date is <u>Tuesday</u>, November 7, 2017.

The Mayor and City Council members serve four-year terms and are elected at large. Anyone interested in filing for one of these offices must:

- Be a U.S. citizen at time of filing
- Be a registered voter of Nibley City
- Be at least 18 years old
- Be a resident of Nibley City for at least 365 consecutive days immediately preceding the date of election (November 7, 2017)
- Not be a convicted felon

Anyone seeking to become a candidate for a municipal office should file a Declaration of Candidacy in person with the Nibley City Recorder or Deputy Recorder at Nibley City Hall, June 1 through June 7, 2017. The appropriate filing form will be available at the Nibley City offices.

Tree Board & Wildlife Association



The evidence has been accumulating for years. Monarch Butterflies are in decline but we can help provide some remedies. Plant milkweed and other native flowers and

avoid using pesticides around them and your gardens. On Saturday, May 20, Becky Yeager and others from the Cache Valley Wildlife Association will be displaying a booth entitled Mariposa (butterfly)Festival at the Gardeners' Market in Logan. Learn about the Monarch lifecycle, their miraculous migrations, planting milkweed, native flowers for your pollinator garden, and newly discovered soil fungus that may also threaten Monarchs. This booth will be fun and educational.

Trees and flowers are being sold throughout the valley now. Look for native species that are fertile for pollinators, and remember to check the cold-hardiness zone. Nibley City is a 4-5 zone. If you choose to buy anything tagged with a higher number you can either take it in-

doors in the Fall, or replace it when it dies in the Winter. Have a *good* time with your Spring planting–good for wildlife, good for landscaping, good for people.

Reminders from Nibley City Staff

Winter Parking Regulations

Nibley City's winter parking regulations are no longer in effect. However, parking vehicles in streets or public rights-of-way can cause a safety hazard with more pedestrians out and about. Nibley City reminds you to be responsible and considerate when parking vehicles on the street.

It is a violation of Nibley City ordinance (Nibley City Code 4-1-4A.) to dump debris into any canal or waterway. Debris can travel downstream, build up at one of the canal grates, and cause a canal to backup and overflow causing damage to surrounding properties. It's important that we keep that water flowing. Spring is here so try to utilize Nibley's recycling bins for yard debris (3390 South 1200 West). It is also important to not place structures or anything along the canals that would make it difficult for canal staff to conduct canal maintenance.

Park Pavillion Reservations

Nibley City's four park pavilions can be reserved online. Park pavilions cost \$25 per pavilion for each reservation made. The four pavilions can be reserved by going to www. nibleycity.com. Click on the blue button on the right side labeled "Facility Rental". If you have any questions, please call Valerie at the Nibley City offices. Pavilion space goes fast this time of year so be sure to plan ahead and save your spot.

Green Waste Recycle Center

Nibley's green waste recycle location is up and going for the season. If you haven't visited the updated site location at 3400 South 1200 West, you should go check it out. Use this site as you get going on your spring yard projects. The site offers a convenient place to dispose of your green waste, including grass clippings, weeds, leaves, branches, and shrubbery. There are also cardboard recycle bins available at the site.
