Nibley City General Election

Don't forget to vote on Tuesday, November 7. Polls are open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. Your vote will elect our City Mayor and two City Council Members. You may vote prior to this date by coming in to the Nibley City offices and filling out an Absentee Application. When coming to vote you

are required to present identification at the poll. See Utah State Code 20A-1-102(83)(a-c) for a list of acceptable identification. Candidates run-

ning for Mayor are Shaun Dustin and Trudy Elise Knight. Candidates for City Council are Kathryn Beus, Allen V. Cook, Garrett Mansell, and Norman L. Larsen. Winter Parking

Nibley's winter parking regulations begin on Wednesday, November 1. Please be sure to keep vehicles off the streets between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. until April 1, 2018.

Winter parking regulations were enacted to keep streets clear should the Public Works Department need to clear the roadways after a snow-storm. However, the ordinance applies whether or not there is snow on the ground.

Please keep your cars off the road to ensure plows can get through. It is also very helpful to pull your garbage containers in from the roadway as soon as possible after pickup. Cache Valley snowstorms can burry those cans pretty quickly. Thank you for your help in keeping Nibley's roads drivable and safe.

Together We Prepare ... Join In

The United States and some if it's territories have recently experienced some devastating disasters. The financial, physical, and emotional costs of these multiple events have been staggering. In reflecting on the devastation caused by these events,

we are once again reminded of the importance of individual, family, and community preparedness. We must ensure that we have taken the necessary steps to prepare for, respond to, and recover from the types of disasters that can potentially affect us here in Nibley City.

As part of the *Be Ready Nibley Campaign*, we encourage residents to take some simple steps as part of that preparedness process:

- Get a Kit of emergency supplies. Be prepared to improvise and use what you have on hand to make it on your own for at least three days, maybe longer. While there are many things that might make you more comfortable, think first about fresh water, food and clean air.
- 2. Make a Plan for what you will do in an emergency. Plan in advance what you will do in an emergency. Be prepared to assess the situation. Use common sense and whatever you have on hand to take care of yourself and your loved ones.
- 3. Be Informed about what might happen. Some of the things you can do to prepare for the unexpected, such as assembling a supply kit and developing a family emergency plan, are the same for both a natural or man-made emergency. By beginning a process of learning about specific threats, you are preparing yourself to react in an emergency.
- **4. Get Involved in preparing your community.** After preparing yourself and your family for possible disasters, take the next step and get involved in preparing the community.


The Hyrum Library

Streetlights in Nibley City

If a streetlight in your neighborhood is not functioning correctly, you may contact Rocky Mountain Power directly at 888-221-7070 or go to www.rockymountainpower.net. Click on the "Safety & Outages" link, then scroll down to "Streetlights" and provide the required information. Nibley City still pays for the streetlight whether or not it is working, so please assist us in keeping Nibley safe and appropriately lit.

Winterize Your Irrigation System


Now is the time to winterize your sprinkling system. Even if you have drained the water out of your irrigation system, some water remains and can freeze, expand, and crack PVC piping. Have your sprinkler pipes blown out to minimize damage and avoid costly leaks and repairs in the Spring.

Snow Plows VS. Mailboxes

Snowplows and mailboxes don't mix. If your mailbox and a city snowplow have an unfortunate encounter, please let us know. Our snowplow drivers do an excellent job and do their best to avoid collisions, but sometimes the conditions lead to an unavoidable mishap. Unfortunately, most mailboxes are hit because they are not built according to the national specification adopted by the United States Postal Service and protrude too far into the roadway. Please keep these design standards in mind when erecting mailboxes. Mailbox design standards can be found at www.usps.com/manage/mailboxes.htm.

This system allows Nibley City to contact residents by phone, text, and/or email. Nibley City encourages all Nibley residents to sign up for this service or to update their contact information to ensure we can reach you and your family. To do this, you will need to go to <code>www.nibleycity.com</code> and click on the blue "Community Alert System" button on the right side of the home page. You can include more than one number and the information gathered will be used strictly for Nibley City purposes. Please be sure to enter your home address because messages are sometimes sent out by area.

If you have any questions about signing up for this important system, please call Nibley City. Nibley City also uses its website, Facebook page (www.facebook/nibley), and Instagram site (www.instagram.com/nibleycity) to communicate important city information.

Tree Board & Wildlife Association



Planting season may be over by the time this newsletter arrives, but perhaps you can set aside some home-decoration budget, or Christmas funds, for landscaping trees next Spring. Trees improve property value,

benefit wildlife, and make your yard beautiful and comfortable. Just don't plant them too close to your home.

Wildlife News

Please consider joining hundreds of Nibley residents and have your yard certified by the National Wildlife Federation as good habitat for songbirds and pollinators. Go to *www.nwf.org*, scroll down to "Certify Your Garden", and follow the simple steps . . . nobody inspects your property. When you're finished, let Ron Hellstern know if you would like a laminated sign to place on your mailbox or fence.

As cold weather approaches and insect populations decline, songbirds that overwinter here can suffer from lack of food. Consider getting bird feeders and sunflower seeds for your yard, and giving them as holiday gifts for friends and relatives. They don't have to be fancy. We recommend buying the larger ones so you don't have to fill them so often. Use a ladder to place them up high if you're worried about deer.

Finally, 30 new bridhouses, built by USU students as part of an Eagle Scout project, were painted and donated to our Wildlife Association. If you know of another scout looking for an Eagle Project, we will need to place these birdhouses in Nibley's parks and other appropriate sites in early spring.
